



NCRTV Museum Covid 19 Visitor Guidelines

An opening date for the Museum has been determined to be Friday, April 23, 2021. We will provide an environment for all our visitors using guidelines to limit and mitigate the effects of COVID-19. Museum administration will follow Centers for Disease Control guidelines for community-based organizations.

OPERATION REVIEW AND GUIDELINES

Health and Safety Guidelines for Guests

- No food or drinks may be brought into the museum from outside.
- Face Masks are required.
- No pets.
- No weapons.
- Please do not enter the museum if you have been in close contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19, are experiencing a cough, shortness of breath, or sore throat right now, or have experienced symptoms like a fever, a new loss of taste or smell, vomiting or diarrhea or fever in the last 48 hours.
- Please maintain a safe distance of at least six feet between your group and employees and other visitors you while are at The National Capital Radio & Television Museum.
- You will see hand-sanitizing stations throughout the museum please use those frequently.
- Be sure to wash hands more frequently, avoid touching your face, practice good respiratory etiquette like sneezing into your elbow rather than into the air.

Health and Safety Guidelines for Employees/Docents

Screening Before Arrival to Work

All docents and staff will be screened for respiratory symptoms and have their body temperature taken as a precautionary measure to reduce the spread of COVID-19. Everyone will be privately screened, including having his or her temperature taken, when reporting to work. The screening questions are:

- Have you been in close contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19?
- Are you experiencing a cough, shortness of breath, or sore throat?
- Have you had a fever in the last 48 hours?
- Have you had new loss of taste or smell?
- Have you had vomiting or diarrhea in the last 24 hours?
- Do you have a temperature of 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or more?

Increased Hygiene Practices

- Be sure to wash hands more frequently, avoid touching face, practice good respiratory etiquette by coughing or sneezing into your elbow rather than into the air.
- Wear a cloth face covering while at work and in public to help protect against the spread of the virus (these will be provided, or you can wear one you bring from home)
- Practice recommended social distancing to the greatest extent possible – “Further is safer.”
- If your position requires the use of disposable gloves, be sure to change as often as recommended.
- You will see new hand-sanitizing stations throughout the museum please use those frequently.

The Museum will keep all sites clean and sanitized throughout the day:

- Sanitize surfaces often between tours.
- Sanitize the front entryway desks and computers every hour.
- Sanitize door handles and handrails after every tour.
- Sanitize bathrooms (handles, sinks and counters, faucets, towel dispenser) after every tour.
- Continue to communicate plan to staff and the guests.
